



KEYNOTE SPEAKERS



JULIA KLEIN

Julia Klein is a climate change and mountain sustainability expert. She is Professor in the Department of Ecosystem Science & Sustainability and a Research Scientist at the Natural Resource Ecology Laboratory at Colorado State University. Klein is also a Mountain Sentinels Network leader.



JAKOB RHYNER

Jakob Rhyner is professor for Global Change and Systemic Risks at the Agricultural Faculty of the University of Bonn and Scientific Director of the Bonn Alliance for Sustainability Research/ Innovation Campus Bonn (ICB). Between 2010-2018, he was Deputy Rector of the United Nations University in Europe and Director of the university's Institute for Environment and Human Security (UNU-EHS). His responsibilities comprised policy-oriented research on environmental risks, including environmentally induced migration, climate risk insurance, as well as education and capacity building.

REINHOLD MESSNER

Reinhold Messner is an Italian mountaineer, explorer and author renowned for his pioneering and difficult ascents of the world's highest peaks. In 1978, he and Peter Habeler were the first to climb Mount Everest without the use of contained oxygen for breathing, and two years later he made the first solo ascent of Mount Everest. He was also the first person to climb all of the 14 world's mountains that exceed an elevation of 8,000 metres. Messner has created the Messner Mountain Museum in South Tyrol, six interrelated thematic museums dedicated to the art, culture, religion and peculiarities of mountain regions throughout the world and served one term (1999–2004) in the European Parliament, where he mainly championed environmental issues. He also published numerous books available in several languages.



DIRK GLAESSER

Dirk Glaesser is Director of the Sustainable Development of Tourism Department at the United Nations World Tourism Organization (UNWTO). Under his supervision, the programme addresses the challenges and opportunities of sustainable tourism development, including climate change, sustainable consumption and production, health emergencies, biodiversity and travel facilitation. It also promotes safe travel behavior and has closely monitored various health emergencies, from SARS, Pandemic Influenza A (H1N1) 2009 to the most recent COVID-19 outbreak, and their impact on travel and tourism. He joined the World Tourism Organization in 1997 and has held various positions in UNWTO, among them Chief of the Risk and Crisis Management Department and supervisor of UNWTO's Consulting Unit on Biodiversity and Tourism. He is the author of a number of publications which have been widely translated.



MUSONDA MUMBA

Musonda Mumba is the Chief of the Terrestrial Ecosystems Unit of UN Environment since 2018. She joined UN Environment in 2008, as a programme officer in Climate Change Adaptation Unit, and led the work on the development of the Global Adaptation Network (GAN). She also led and coordinated the Ecosystems based Adaptation (EbA) Mountain Programme, a programmatic alliance with UN Environment, IUCN and UNDP (2011 – 2016) working in Peru, Nepal and Uganda. She has also been UN Environment's focal point on Mountains. She has over 20 years experience working at both scientific and political levels on climate change adaptation, conservation, protected areas management and wetlands ecology. Her professional experience led her to work with several governments across the world cutting across Africa, Asia and Latin America.

JOSEPH STIGLITZ

Joseph Stiglitz is an US-American economist, public policy analyst and professor at Columbia University. He is a former senior vice president and chief economist of the World Bank and a former member of President Clinton's Council of Economic Advisers. Stiglitz received the Nobel Memorial Prize in Economics (2001) and the John Bates Clark Medal (1979). In 2011, Time magazine listed him as one of the 100 most influential people in the world. Stiglitz's academic work focuses on income distribution, asset risk management, corporate governance and international trade. He is also author of several books including "Freefall" (2010), in which he addresses the causes of the 2008 recession and proposes reforms to avoid similar crises in the future.


GLOBAL MOUNTAIN SAFEGUARD RESEARCH (GLOMOS) PROGRAMME
